#### Reopening Update from the Rector

Starting November 29<sup>th</sup>, we will be open for limited *(25% of building capacity)*, in-person, socially distanced, and on-campus worship. The YouTube worship you have grown to love **will** continue. We don't want anyone who is vulnerable to feel pressure to come on campus. Whether you are at 1550 Diablo, in your home, or in Singapore on Sunday morning, we are in this together.

The YouTube service will stream concurrently at 10am and both the 8am and 10am service will be like what we have been doing for the last few months.

"Safer" worship note - I want to emphasize two things at the same time.

- 1. We will be following all appropriate sanitation practices to keep you safe.
- 2. We cannot guarantee zero risk.

**Worship details -** The week before Sunday worship, we will have a sign-up genius available for you to reserve a spot. There is a series of medical conditions that by signing up, you will affirm that you do not have things like coughs and sniffles, as well as not testing COVID positive in the last 14 days.

**You don't want to deal with sign up genius?** That is fine. Please call or email the office by 2pm the Thursday before the Sunday in question to assure that your spot is reserved.

**The day of worship -** I am profoundly aware of how isolated some of you feel from your church home. I am eager to be with you, worship with you, and celebrate our life together. I offer a description below of how Sunday will feel on campus.

- Our usher or greeter will be scanning your temperature with a touchless thermometer.
- You can sit (all masked) with your family in a social bubble. People not in your household will need to maintain 6ft social distancing. We will arrange the space to make that easy.
- There will be no distribution of communion at any service.
- We will not pass the plate, but a touchless offering plate is available.
- This is new from the diocese you can say corporate prayers like the Lord's Prayer since we will be masked for the duration of the service.
- There will be a small group of masked choral singers at the 10am service, but not at the 8am service.
- There will be no paper bulletins, the entire bulletin will be projected.
- For now, we will not have the nursery open.
- We will not be having coffee or sharing food, but we can chat and say hello to each other!

# **Thanksgiving Food Drive for Monument Crisis Center**

2020 has been a different year in so many ways and the holiday season promises to be different as well. For several logistical reasons, the Outreach Committee has decided to participate in the Monument Crisis Center (MCC) Thanksgiving Food Drive instead of Christmas Food Boxes.

#### **HOW WILL THIS WORK?**

Monument Crisis Center is asking their supporters to fill plastic grocery bags with 7 items that will furnish the food for a traditional Thanksgiving dinner. They will purchase a turkey for each bag. St. Timothy's invites you to purchase one or more sets of the items listed below (cranberries = sauce, 2 cans of vegetables), put them in plastic grocery bag(s) and bring them to church on

## **OUTREACH GRANTS 2020**

Thank you St Timothy's parishioners and the vestry for supporting the Outreach effort this 'different' year. Once again we have been able to generously respond to our Outreach community because of your amazing support. Our 'Outreach ministries' focus on shelter, homeless services, hunger prevention, mental health, addiction recovery and global health. It is usual for this community to give of both our time and our financial support. Without our "hands" as volunteers, plus the extra need due to economic hardship and the restrictions imposed by Covid, this has been a very challenging year for many of our ministries. Our parish member liaisons have kept us informed, as the year progressed, of the additional demand for services caused by the crisis.

The funds for the grants allocated in table below come from Fruits of the Harvest (this year a virtual gathering), Amazon Smile, the parish operating budget and two additional donations.

The Outreach committee with approval from the vestry was able to donate in April \$10,000 [money in the church funds provided by a donor and designated to be used at some time of local crisis] to 6 of our local charities. In June an additional \$15,000 given to Outreach from a donor, plus \$1000 from the diocese for emergency relief was allocated to 7 of our charities. In October a record \$70,550 was allocated to our ministries [see below table] most of this raised by the generous giving to "FOTH reinvented."

[An additional \$3000 is given to The Divinity School, The School for Deacon's and the Interfaith Council by the church each year from the church funds]



A woman inherits a beloved bookstore and sets forth on a journey of self-discovery in this poignant debut about family, forgiveness and a love of reading. Miranda Brooks grew up in the stacks of her eccentric Uncle Billy's bookstore, solving the inventive scavenger hunts he created just for her. But on Miranda's twelfth birthday, Billy has a mysterious falling-out with her mother and suddenly disappears from Miranda's life.

### **VESTRY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS**

ST TIMOTHY'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH VESTRY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS – OCTOBER 2020 The vestry met on Wednesday, October 21 at 6:30 pm via Zoom

#### MOTIONS:

- The Vestry voted unanimously to approve the proposed distribution of the Outreach funds for 2020 as recommended by the Outreach Committee The total funds for this distribution are \$70,550. The funds include the proceeds of Fruits of the Harvest, the allocation from the parish budget and the funds generated by Amazon Smile. Details on the grants in 2020 can be found elsewhere in the November Tidings.
- The vestry voted unanimously to approve the procedures proposed by the Treasurer, Neal Matsunaga for the clergy discretionary fund. The fund is part of the budget and its status will become a part of the Treasurer's report each month. The Rector's Warden and the Treasurer will receive the detailed monthly reports regarding expenditures.
- The Vestry voted unanimously to approve the 5 resolutions from the Treasurer regarding the benefits for parish employees in 2021.
- The Vestry voted unanimously to approve the minutes of the September 2020 vestry meeting, the Treasurer's report, the Rector's Report and the reports from the Outreach and Property Commissions. ACTION ITEMS:
- BUDGET: Vestry members will review the Source column in the Budget Worksheet file distributed by the Treasurer and supply input for the 2021 budget for the lines where they are named
- VESTRY 2021: The 5 people who will go off vestry in 2021 will constitute the Vestry Search Committee along with the Rector and the Associate Rector. The group will decide on possible candidates before contacting them.

Parish members are welcome to attend Vestry meetings. The next meeting is on Wednesday, November 18, 2020. Contact Sally Shea Potts to receive an invitation to the Zoom meeting.

The minutes of the vestry meeting will be filed in the Parish Office after they are approved by the Vestry.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

October 21, 2020

## **Financial Highlights**

- Financial results through September are positive overall due to inclusion of PPP loan funds in the
  Other Income part of the operating budget. There is an underrun in Pledge Income due mainly to
  pledges that have not made any or are behind in payments and an underrun in Expenses
  reflecting a decrease in expenses due to shelter in place protocols.
- Pledge income in our approved budget for 2020 is based on 159 pledges. Our budget included a
  projected revenue shortfall of about \$58,400 (\$13,400 more pledge dollars assumed and a
  projected deficit of \$45,034.
- Year to date budget vs actual results, adjusted for amortizing "pledges paid in full" in the current year, are:

#### Income

The Pledge Income difference reflects about \$15,825 for pledges that have not made any payments yet through the first 9 months of 2020 and about \$31,299 for pledges that are behind in payments. Had this money been received our pledge income would have been about \$12,199 over budget.

#### Other Income difference due to:

Loose Plate \$(5,980) and Facilities Cost Sharing \$(5,999) under budget offset by Contributing Income about \$9,840 above budget and inclusion of \$73,329 of PPP loan funds as operating income.

Expenses – Operating expense difference is the sum of a number of over and under budget items, with the main ones being:

Personnel expenses \$18,821 under budget

Altar Guild expenses \$2,649 under budget

Christian Formation expenses \$813 under budget

Children & Youth Ministry expenses \$2,616 under budget

Fellowship expenses \$2,610 under budget

Administrative expenses \$7,524 under budget

Facilities expenses \$671 under budget

Finance expenses \$(10,585) over budget due to timing of insurance and property tax payments. Contingency expenses \$2,815 under budget

  - Have received \$54,220
