SRVUSD Board Meeting, November 14th



CONNECTIONS ARE A GIFT OF LOVE



Connections are a Gift of Love. God, help me to Love all your people...

As we began to talk it appeared as though her eyes were focused on somewhere else - another time, another place. The tears fell quietly, as she remembered her dad who was working in the hospital when it was bombed and her home in rubble. News sometimes brought back uninvited memories.

My friend said little to me before the baptism of their daughter-only that her husband and his older sister were born in a refugee camp; his sister had the worst of it. - His parents had survived, but it was a long journey getting to America. Her in-laws didn't talk about surviving.

The story was joyful. The grandmother had just returned after having met her new grandson and seeing her two older grandchildren so happy and growing strong. Then, two days of not being able to reach anyone. The call came. "We are alright. We are

staying with friends."

We all have moments that crash into the present. Occasionally we remember the luminous joy of Love; sometimes we are startled by memories we believed we left in the past. When we recollect a person we have loved or a moment when everything fell apart, we are grateful that someone is listening to us. *God*, *help us to listen*, *help us to pray*.

For many, this time of conflict and stories from the news challenge our capacity to witness the pain and devastation happening in the world around us. News stories of violence and natural disasters can remind us of events that shattered our own lives or family. The harm done by violence enters our very bones and we long for a healing breath from God—for ourselves, for our family, for our friends, and for the scarred world. *God helps us to heal. God, bring healing in our world in a way I know I do not understand.*

Jesus cared for the broken, the sick at heart and the sick in mind. Jesus loved the leaders and the sinners, the humble and the proud. Jesus loved the children. Jesus suffered and died, witnessed by leaders of political and religious institutions and people that loved him and people that did not know him. God's promise of resurrection was a new life, a new heart, God's own heart in Christ in us. We are called to pray, to purify our own hearts, to weep, to lament, to fast, and to listen. *In Christ's Love may we be bearers of Peace to one another and to the strangers we do not know.*

RICE AND BEANS

RICE AND BEANS FOR CHRISTMAS FOOD BOXES – SUNDAY NOVEMBER 12



On Sunday, November 12, join us in the parish hall after the morning services to bag rice and beans.

QUESTION: Who can help with this activity?

EVERYONE — We will scoop rice or beans out of big bowls on the table and put them into a quart zip lock bag. The bags are zipped closed and put into a bucket. When Christmas Food Boxes are filled at church or by parish members or Noah's Ark Preschool members, we add 1 bag of rice and one of beans to each box.

QUESTION: Why do we add bags of rice and beans to the Christmas Food Boxes? Several years ago, the staff looked for a way to involve the children in the parish in the Christmas Food Boxes Outreach activity. Lori Robinson came up with the idea of bagging rice and beans and adding it to the boxes. We have continued to do that since then.

QUESTION: Why rice and beans?

Rice and beans is a dish made from a combination of staple foods in many cultures around the world. The grain and legume provide several important nutrients and many calories, and both foods are widely available. Rice and beans are vegetarian and make up a complete protein. A 1 cup serving of rice and beans has 32 percent of an adult's daily intake of energy-providing, complex carbohydrates. *Wikipedia*.

Halloween is almost here and that means it's time to prepare for our annual effort to make the holidays a little brighter for our friends who are clients at Monument Crisis Center (MCC). Each year since 2011 (except 2020), St. Timothys has supplied over 175 boxes of food for MCC clients.

Great News #1: We do not need to include a grocery gift card in the box. Monument Crisis Center with the help of the Food Bank is covering that requirement this year. Everyone's cost this year is less!

Great News #2: Alamo Safeway will again deliver our grocery order for the Fill-My-Box boxes to the church on Friday, December 1 so we can fill boxes on Saturday morning, December 2!

ADOPT-A-FAMILY BIKES

What is it? Adopt a Family Bikes is program that started at St. Timothy's in 2002. Bikes are donated by individuals and bike shops in the community, and volunteers clean, and repair the bikes. A new helmet accompanies all bikes, and new U-locks go with every bike for middle schoolers and older. The bikes are distributed to local non-profits, Title 9 schools, and thru school counselors at SRVUSD. Each year we move into donated space in November, and deliver the last of the bikes when school opens again in January. 263 bikes were donated last year just from this holiday program alone. This year we are starting 3 weeks earlier!

Where & When? We are located in the Alamo Safeway shopping center in Suite 140A next to Rite Aid. We will be open Saturdays & Sundays 10-5 (except possibly Thanksgiving & Christmas weekend). The schedule will vary after Christmas depending on supply and demand. We will vacate the space before January 21st. Our schedule is posted at www.adoptafamilybikes.org/welcome/schedule

Donated Bikes are accepted during our operating hours until we reach capacity, usually around Dec. 10th. A donation of \$25 per bike is requested to defray the costs of helmets, parts, locks, and delivery. Cash or checks made out to St. Timothy's with a note Adopt-A-Family Bikes. Please no rusty bikes. Bike trailers are much needed for the homeless. Scooters, bike tandems, wagons, and plastic riding toys are not accepted. Adult and child tri-cycles are welcome.

Volunteers need not be bike mechanics. If you can wipe down a bike, that is up on a table, with **409** then we need you! Mechanics welcome too! No need to sign up, just walk in! Volunteers are needed through Christmas at the same times and location. The suite is heated and there is a drinking fountain/bottle filler. Yes, children under the age of 16 welcome with adult supervision.

Bike recipients include, but are not limited to: Options Recovery, Trinity Center, San Ramon Valley Unified School District, Mt. Diablo Unified School District, Youth Homes, Students Rising Above, and SFSU Guardian Program.


BOOK GROUP

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 19 – 11:15 AM – OVERBY LIBRARY

Join the St. Timothy's book group in reading (or rereading) <u>A Gentleman in Moscow</u> by Amor Towles and coming to the Overby Library on Sunday, November 19 to discuss it.

The story begins when Count Alexander Ilyich Rostov is unceremoniously sentenced to life imprisonment in Moscow's Metropol hotel. And for all that it is a prison, it is a luxurious one. The year is 1922, and behind it all, looms the haunting specter of a country that is at the fragile end of a brutal history: an ill-timed glance or a foot set in an unfortunate spot can bring down death and woe upon anyone, in the form of a bullet to the head or an exile to Siberia.

Alexander Ilyich Rostov, however, finds a fire, a ferocious brightness in this new existence. The Hotel Metropol is a world unto itself, and within its walls, "the world," has indeed, "come and gone". Over the years, Alexander forges a link between him and several residents of the hotel—the chefs, the doormen, the bartenders, the seamstresses—and creates a door that he can knock at and count on being opened at any time. But soon, the long years begin to press into Alexander's life from every angle, and he begins to feel, for the first time, the true weight of his sentence. The fear that he wouldn't ever leave the hotel, that



he would stay and grow old and bent and be put in the ground there, is now a constant echo knifing through the count's thoughts. The hotel is Alexander's prison, and it is his sanctuary, but for how much longer can it be either?

According to one reviewer: "This is a novel with an abundance of things to say, with profound moving ruminations on selfhood, friendship, parenthood and the devastating unattainability of modest hopes. It is a novel driven so fiercely and so clearly by a deep urge to make observations about people, to see them, truly see them, and in turn, let them see themselves in all their glorious and sometimes mundane glory. The resulting narrative is an emotionally and intellectually rewarding experience; people, after all (to borrow some of the Count's own words) "deserve not only our consideration, but our reconsideration."

FOTH 2023 & OUTREACH GRANTS

St. Timothy's certainly knows how to party, and we always step up for Outreach. Our 2023 FOTH event, *Mama Mia That's Italian*, raised over \$52,000 after expenses. The annual allocation from the Operating Budget of \$18,000 and carry-over funds from prior years added to the FOTH proceeds and gave us \$71,619 to distribute to our Outreach organizations.

VESTRY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

October

The Vestry met on Wednesday, October 18, 2023, at 6:30pm in the Conference Room in Grace House.

MOTIONS:

- The Vestry unanimously approved the September Vestry meeting minutes, the reports and documents submitted by the treasurer, and several submitted rector and commission reports submitted prior to the meeting.
- The Vestry unanimously approved the Outreach grants as presented by the Outreach Commissioner. It was further discussed that the programs and those involved with time, talent, and donations in these programs would be recognized in the future.
- The Vestry unanimously approved to charge the Property Team to consult with the City of Danville to further investigate possible arborists who would be immediately available to trim trees. If the City is unable to provide a recommendation, the vestry will call for an e-vote to approve initial Traverso bid.


