Merry Advent y'all,

I am really looking forward to our time together in December. This is an unusual year, as there are effectively only three Advent Sundays.

#### **Christmas Eve**

December 24<sup>th</sup> is 'Advent 4' and obviously Christmas Eve as well. The worship team and I decided to celebrate Christmas Eve at 3pm, 5pm and 7pm and NOT have December 24<sup>th</sup> Sunday morning services.

### Advent Wreath Lighting and Children in Church

For our 3 Sundays in Advent (December 3rd, 10th & 17th), we will have different families lighting the Advent wreath at the beginning of church (right after the opening song). See Pastor Susan's article about our children's offerings during the 10am service.

Also, for our 3 Sundays in Advent, I will be leading a discussion on the history and politics of Israel / Palestine. It will be in the Parish Hall from 9:15am to 9:45am. I know a lot of history, but am hardly an expert. I hope to offer a methodology for how to understand your faith considering the Middle East, ancient and modern. It will **not** be livestreamed.



### Gaudete / Blue Sunday

Dec 17<sup>th</sup> 8am, 10am **AND** 4pm

Traditionally, the third Sunday of Advent is called "Gaudete Sunday." In the olden days, Advent was considered a mini-Lent. In this older approach, individual and corporate practices were geared toward penitence and preparation. As things have evolved over time, there is still a heavy emphasis on preparation. Advent today is still about preparation, but is more connected thematically to faith, hope and love in the season. The reason I tell you this is that Gaudete Sunday (December 17th) will be a break to rejoice in the midst of this mini-Lent.

### **Rejoice and Be Blue**

Without Advent being a mini-Lent, the call to rejoice is still the same. On this day, December 17<sup>th</sup> 2023, we also want to offer a different pathway for some during the holidays. Many people feel less connected, less rejoiceful in December because culture elevates family and togetherness above all else. For those who have family that have moved, died, or otherwise been separated from, they actually feel "blue" during the jingle jangle of Christmas red and green. So, we will offer Blue Christmas in church on December 17<sup>th</sup> at 4pm. It will be beautiful, quiet, worshipful and holy. We will have liturgy that is meditative and music appropriate to the vibe.

We are suggesting a donation of \$10 for the candles.

On Sunday mornings, children will gather briefly in the Children's Liturgy room in Parish Hall, share a scripture lesson and then join the congregation quietly. Advent is an exciting time in the life of the Church as we prepare for Christmas and think about our own longing for baby Jesus to be born. Children may join their parents in a pew or sit with parents at the back of the church with activities which help them to focus on what they are seeing in church.

Children and families will light our Advent wreath at the beginning of the worship service as we anticipate the coming of Christmas and the Light coming into the world.

# **RISE AGAINST HUNGER MEAL PACKING**

We Packaged 16,632 Meals!

Thanks to the hardworking effort of the volunteers and donors, we were able to package a total of 16,632 meals. That's enough to feed 77 children for an entire school year. Since we started hosting the event in 2016, St. Timothy's has packaged 135,396 meals for Rise Against Hunger.



Since we are located in the Bay Area, the meals are likely to be sent to Southeast Asia to areas of food insecurity, orphanages and schools. Rise Against Hunger is also focusing on distributing meals to Ukrainian refugees displaced by war. We'll provide an update when we know exactly where our meals were sent.

This international service project will make a difference in many lives. On behalf of the Outreach Ministries Committee, thank you for answering the call to serve. We hope you also had some fun in the process!

















































# NEW LITURGICAL YEAR

On **December 3<sup>rd</sup>**, the **first Sunday of Advent**, you will see a large hand painted banner hanging above the altar. It is a contemporary abstract piece painted by Kathy Wills and Leslie Firth. The dark colors of blues and purples evoke a feeling of unease and mystery. It is a time of anticipation and reflection. Something big is coming. At the top of the banner there is part of a sun with golden rays of light. It represents the hope and love that is coming into the world with the birth of Jesus.

The wreaths on the pillars around the church have blue bows this year for Advent, and the pedestal under the cross and altar are draped with blue fabric.

**Christmas Eve** there will be a large white banner with a giant glittering star. The three dimensional center looks like an explosion of light. There is a suggestion of a cross made of sticks that was actually a happy accident which I then decided to emphasize. It makes me think of the birth and death at the same time of the life of Jesus.

This took about six weeks to create on my dining room table. It slowly evolved to what you see today. I tried

using glitter but it looked like gray from a distance. I bought ¼" glitter by the pound in order for it to have a sparkling affect, and tiny mirrors glued on reflected the light the way I wanted it to look. I can't wait to see how it will shine with the new lighting on the circle of lights above the altar.


**Helpers Needed:** This banner will be installed on **Tuesday, December 20<sup>th</sup> at 10 am.** It is interesting to install because the center piece has to be attached by me to the banner with the help of two people. I will need 6 or 7 people to help put this together. It should take about two hours or less. The big ladder will be needed. Also, one person will be needed to change the bows on the wreaths to red ones.

**Epiphany** will be celebrated on **Sunday**, **January 6**<sup>th</sup>, and the banner will need to come down right after the last service around 11:15. About 6 **helpers will be needed to take it all down** and roll up the banner for storage.

# CONTRA COSTA INTERFAITH COALITION

Thank you, St. Timothy's, for your ongoing support of this amazing little non-profit that makes such a difference for the neediest in our community. The outreach grant of \$5,000 we were enabled CCIC to immediately bought more much needed mattresses.

As of mid-October, this all-volunteer non- profit has provided essential furnishings, bedding, kitchen ware, cleaning supplies, and furnishings to **over 118 families!** The families are clients of over 20 C.C. County social service agencies and are referred by their case workers. All are unhoused, transitioning to permanent housing. Most have nothing.

All these families have been helped for \$22K to date this year. The largest expenses are new mattresses (\$14k, purchased from St. Vincent de Paul for under \$300 each), and food cards (\$6500).

You will see requests ongoing because the need is constant. Gently used towels, kitchen items (especially silverware and water glasses), bedding (not King), small furnishings, mattresses free of tears for stains. For more information contact Tania at <u>taniahd@comcast.net</u> www.ccichope.org

# LOAVES & FISHES OF CONTRA COSTA

Grand reopening of the Martinez Dining Room was on November 10<sup>th</sup>. Loaves & Fishes has been serving for 40 years. This year, it has been chosen as the non-profit of the year by Senator Dodd of Sacramento.

Loaves and Fishes Martinez Dining Room re-opened their Martinez Dining room on November 10<sup>th</sup> to start having guests dine inside again. They are doing a hybrid system of still serving food in to-go containers out the door and also having seated guests at tables in the dining room as before.



Our loyal volunteers from Saint Timothy's have been on hiatus for 3 years due to the pandemic. We have missed going, but the good news is that **we will begin volunteering again on the fourth Monday of the month starting in January.** Our volunteer roster is down to 8 people. We need to have 8 people present to help on our day. Some of us have been volunteering at L & F for over 20 years. Once you go to Loaves and Fishes to help, you will want to be a regular volunteer.

We welcome new volunteers to our roster because we must always have substitutes to fill in due to vacations, illness, conflicts, etc. This is a commitment of once a month in Martinez from 9:30am to 1:15pm. (Some of us carpool the 30 minute drive.) Not everyone will be able to attend every month. You must be able-bodied, and it entails standing while chopping food and serving quickly. There is a kitchen director to give us instructions.

It is one of the most gratifying hands-on ministries that we do to serve others. Joann O, Dave S, and I have volunteered while we were on hiatus and, we all realized how much we missed doing this work. You get to know the regular clients, and they are so grateful for the food.

### November

The Vestry met on Wednesday, November 15, 2023, at 6:30pm in the Conference Room in Grace House.

#### MOTIONS:

- The Vestry unanimously approved the October Vestry meeting minutes, the reports and documents submitted by the treasurer, and several submitted rector and commission reports submitted prior to the meeting.
- The Vestry unanimously approved to accept the Diocese's 2.9% COLA increase.
- The Vestry unanimously approved to accept Traverso Tree Company's bid, up to \$11,000 for the removal of three liquid amber trees, grinding stumps, and the trimming of the valley oak adjacent to Diablo Road.

# WINTER NIGHTS FAMILY SHELTER

### SAVE THE DATE! WINTER NIGHTS SHELTER (WNS)

January 15 – 29

With the help of St. Timothy's and Beth Chaim volunteers, we will once again open Parish Hall to become a WNS serving approximately 25 guests (families with children.) We will



provide breakfast, lunch, and dinner; laundry services; showers; assistance with homework; space for play and relaxation. Transportation, counseling, and other services to help families move into stable housing are provided by the WNS program. <u>https://cccwinternights.org/</u>

St. Timothy's has hosted the **<u>Family Shelter</u>** since the program began in 2004. We also support other programs offered by WNS with donations of extra food and supplies to:

**<u>Oasis Day Center</u>** – During the daytime, families can go to the Oasis Center in Concord with access to laundry, computers and other support services.

<u>**Two Safe Parking Program Locations</u>** – Provide a safe place to park overnight for families and individuals living in their cars. Clients have access to restrooms, food, and weekly mobile showers.</u>

<u>**Continued Success Program**</u> – Maintains connections with alumni households to help the families stay housed.
