I want to tell of a few things that happened since we last talked.

Vital + Thriving (V + T)

Vital + Thriving is a process where we prayerfully listen and create a strategic plan for the future of St. Timothy's. As we push ahead, we will be building a "missional innovation team" to facilitate the next steps.

More information will be coming as we process the data. But for now, we heard several things clearly.

- We are getting older but are ready to explore new ways of ministry.
- We want to use our campus to leverage maximum impact on our local community.
- We are open to the future.

One thing I heard clearly was a desire for more contemporary music. Starting on Pentecost Sunday, we will be blending more contemporary music into worship. We won't dispense with

hymns, but will find a more vital balance between the old and new.

On page 2, I have included a list of songs for starting the newer music conversation. You may or may not recognize these songs, but we want to hear from you about your favorites. We don't have a band, and likely



will not get one right now, so the contemporary songs need to be piano driven.

Noah's Ark

I announced on Palm Sunday that Noah's Ark will be closing. Due to very low enrollment, your vestry and clergy made the very difficult decision to end an era.

New / Old Visitation Ministry

I want you to be part of our new visitation ministry. It's less formal than lay eucharistic visitors that required licensure. On Trinity Sunday, May 26 after 10am service, we will have a quick training (about 30 minutes) to equip you to make "house calls" with communion. You don't have to go on a Sunday, but do need to bring the box back by Thursday. This ministry is focused on those who aren't always able to come to church.

Youth Mission Update

You might have heard in church that we are not going to go to Mexico for a house build this summer. We made that decision because of travel advisories. So, I want to look ahead to new possibilities. A group of parents and I are planning a local mission trip in late June (within five hours of Danville.)

On Pentecost Sunday, I am asking these families to do a mini fundraiser by hosting coffee hour after the 10am service. We will put a basket out and would love for you to donate to the Mission trip. You can also put on your check memo "2024 mission trip."

LIGHT AND SHADOW

Did you see it? Did you take a moment to witness the eclipse in any way? I watched the shadows. I remembered that in 2017 the shadows seemed to have a strange shape and I did



not understand. My neighbor, sitting in a beach chair gazing at the sky, while his young son wearing funny glasses played and watched, later explained the significance of the scooped-out portion of the leaves, that I suddenly could interpret. This time, I wanted a picture. Watching, watching, watching and I did not see the tell-tale crescent forming in the shadows of the leaves. The time of the shadow came and went. I thought I missed what I longed to see.

Later, as watched NASA, and television monitoring, I realized I did not miss the eclipse. I saw it through other camera lenses, and stranger's eyes. Millions traveled far to see this strange sight of darkness and shadow and light marveling at the mystery and sometimes humbled by the greatness of the mystery of the cosmos and our little piece of it as a single being on this unique

planet earth. I learned my brother and his family had experienced the darkness. In the path of 99% eclipse, my sister's school let out all the children early and sent them home in buses holding glasses in their hands. I saw the moment through different eyes--and I too remembered when I was a child holding funny glasses and pieces of film.

The season of Easter is about the stories of the witnesses who saw the Risen Christ. Their lives changed and the lives of the people to whom they told the stories found their lives transformed also. Stories were later written down and we have the Gospels, Mark, Matthew, Luke and John and the book of Acts. We have theologians and storytellers through the ages that try to articulate what this means for us and how a joy-filled life is an experience to be shared with others. We have the witnesses of people of faith whose lives who may be hugely different from our own lives and they are transformed by an encounter with Jesus in their own life and their lives of their community. The power of freedom in the Gospel songs of slaves moving toward freedom, still makes me tremble with awe.

How is this Light transforming us today to care anew for this fragile earth, our island home? How is Christ through the power of the Spirit reaching into our lives to bring reconciliation and healing into a grieving, wounded and broken world and neighborhood? The surprise is that **we** are the witnesses—not because we asked, simply because Christ has appeared to us in so many different ways. Are we listening to stories of friend and stranger; are we sharing our stumbling, crescent shaped stories with others—family and the one we walking along side of us in the everyday moments? Sometimes in life, it is by paying attention to the shadows in our lives that we discover Truth and Light and a greater compacity for compassion. It seems to me, that faith grows both in the darkness of shadows and in the Light because Christ is there in All.

God, guide me with your Light, help me to forgive more deeply, help me allow myself to be forgiven and set free, and teach me more of your Love in the power of the Risen One, that I too may be a witness to Christ's Light in the world.

OUTREACH NEWS

Monument Crisis Center

The staff, volunteers, and clients of Monument Crisis Center (MCC) are celebrating the return of their Executive Director, Sandra Scherer after a year of absence during her cancer



treatment. During her absence, everyone pitched in to keep operations and fund-raising going – particularly her son, Danny, who served as interim director during her absence. MCC saw a 42% increase in the number of households and a 36% increase in the number of individuals using their services in 2023.
