Happy Fall y'all

With fall upon us, I am looking forward to the good things we have planned.

Worship timing

8am and 10am worship will continue. When we first started planning to regather in-person worship, we made the first service at 8am to accommodate COVID cleaning protocols between services. It seemed good to me to keep 8am and 10am so that early worshipers could come to adult education along with 10am worshipers at 9am. I hope this education "halfish-hour" can serve as a bridge for our two worshiping communities as well as bridging two campuses: remote people and those who come on St. Timothy's grounds.

The church began as an authentic refuge for the rejected, lost, and marginalized, but from the very beginning found itself aligning with those who held power to assure its safety. We will do some history, look at scripture each Sunday, and think about our own balance of safety and authenticity. God pulls us to authenticity without guaranteeing our safety.

I am delighted to introduce our interim director of youth, Robbie Frederiksen. Robbie brings experience, laughter, faith, and creativity to his role. We are committed to providing meaningful and fun opportunities so that our youth grow in faith and know they are valued in our community.

Robbie is reaching out to our youth, checking in with them, and seeking ways to support them. In addition, he will be offering in-person youth fellowship for high school youth the second and fourth Sunday of each month, starting September 12 at 4pm.

Middle school youth will have fellowship time with Robbie on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday nights of each month, and those gatherings will take place at 5:30pm, starting September 8.

Robbie is sending out all the information. And the news gets even better: as we seek to grow our youth programs, we will be partnering with San Ramon Valley United Methodist Church (SRVUMC). We will take turns hosting fellowship on each campus.

The 2nd and 4th Sundays /Wednesdays of the month, fellowship will be at SRVUMC The 4th Sunday/Wednesday of the month, fellowship will be at St Tim's. (Sounds like a complicated schedule at first, but we'll get used to it!)

SRVUMCs is only 3.2 miles from St. Timothy's. Robbie is also planning service opportunities, retreats and other gatherings. He'll be in touch with parents and youth as these events are scheduled. We will be encouraging parents to host other events and hope to have a parent coordinator helping us with that. We will carefully observe all current COVID protocols to keep everyone safe and ask that all parent volunteers show proof of vaccination when working with youth.

I want to hear from you as we continue to focus on our families and youth. As parents and pastors, both Mantu from SRVUMC and I look forward to all the good yet to come in our youth program.

REMEMBER TO VOTE!! A reminder to set aside time to complete your ballot (all Registered California Voters received a ballot by mail)

- MAIL IT by Sept 14; OR Polling locations will be open 7:00a –
 8:00p to drop your ballot
- OR vote in person. **Not registered?** Deadline 9/7- last day to request vote by mail ballot.

You can also register and vote same day using CONDITIONAL VOTER REGISTRATION: through Election Day you can still register and vote in person. It is a one-stop opportunity to register and cast your ballot; available at the Contra Costa County elections office, Regional Early Voting sites, *and all polling places on Election Day*. Remember, you can drop your completed ballot at ANY polling location (work in SF?, drop your ballot in SF!) See you at the voting booths!

No glass, bread, sweets, or expired food, please.



St Timothy's Book Group- September 16, 2021 Book of Lost Friends

Join the members of St Timothy's book group on Thursday, September 16th at 2:00 pm via Zoom to discuss the <u>Book of Lost Friends</u> by Lois Wingate.



Lois Wingate created this novel based on the "Lost Friends" advertisements that ran in many southern newspapers after the Civil War when newly freed slaves searched for loved ones who had been sold away or escaped slavery before the end of the war. It also explores the migration of many in the South to Texas after the war in search of a way to recover from the financial devastation of the war and reconstruction. The story of the three women migrating to Texas is discovered by a first-year teacher in 1987 who comes to a rural school in Louisiana to teach and cancel her student debt. Learning about the lives for the 3 women migrating to Texas in the 1870's helps her to understand her new community and the lives of her students.

Treasurer's Report

August 18, 2021

Financial Highlights

- Financial results through July are positive overall despite underruns in loose plate offerings and facilities cost sharing due to the underruns being offset by higher than budgeted pledge and contributing income to date
- Year to date budget vs actual results, adjusted for amortizing "pledges paid in full" in the current year, are:

Pledge Income difference due mainly to:

Pledges better than budgeted.

Other Income difference due mainly to:

Loose Plate \$(4,322) and Facilities Cost Sharing \$(9,020) under budget offset by Contributing Income \$12,197 above budget.

Expenses – Operating expense difference is the sum of a number of under budget items, with the main ones being:

Personnel expenses \$6,925 under budget due mainly to \$5,946 for administrative assistant/office manager and \$1,685 for childcare assistant positions being vacant.

Altar Guild expenses \$1,135 under budget

Music expenses \$1,591 under budget

Children & Youth Ministry expenses \$1,109 under budget

Fellowship expenses \$1,487 under budget

Administrative expenses \$5,895 under budget

Facilities expenses \$17,044 under budget

Finance expenses \$7,776 under budget

Contingency expenses \$2,108 under budget

August 2021

The vestry met via Zoom on Wednesday, August 18, at 6:30 pm - Zoom

MOTIONS:

- Approved the changes to the staff holiday schedule as proposed by the Treasurer. Starting
 in 2022 all the staff Letters of Agreement will contain the following: New Year's, Martin
 Luther King, President's, Memorial, Independence, Labor, Thanksgiving, Friday after
 Thanksgiving, and Christmas Day.
- Approved enabling access to part of the church WIFI network for groups that sign an
 agreement for the responsible usage of the WIFI. The Administration Commission will work
 to isolate such usage.
- Approved the proposed clergy sabbaticals in 2021 and 2022. Pastor Todd will take his 3-month sabbatical in November and December 2021 and January 2022 returning for the Annual Meeting. Pastor Susan will take her 2-month sabbatical starting in the summer of 2022.
- Approved the minutes of the June vestry meeting and the several reports by the treasurer, rector and several commissions submitted prior to the meeting.

OTHER ACTIONS:

- Treasurer, Neal M. with the help of the Finance Committee is drafting a revision of the Personnel Policy Manual.
- Vestry members were asked to review and provide updates for the website pages for which they are responsible. Ade A. is coordinating this.
- Pastor Todd updated the vestry on the status of the search for a new Music Director.
- Pastor Todd updated the vestry on his plans for Adult Education starting in September 2021
- Pastor Todd updated the vestry on the plan to share a part time youth minister with the Methodist church in Alamo.
- Pastor Todd updated the vestry on his plans to share the construction of the scripture slides for the Sunday services.

Parish members are welcome to attend Vestry meetings. The next meeting is on Wednesday, September 15, 2021. Currently, the plan is for that meeting to use Zoom. Contact Sally P. for an invitation to the meeting.

The foundation was laid by the parishioners, priests and volunteers who helped in shaping the ministry of the church for the community where future generations would cherish for years and years to come.

Noah's Ark is truly a place for everyone as we welcome voices of all ages and backgrounds, where love grows and kindness matters. Noah's Ark is also where the values of integrity and self-esteem exemplify our commitment in building a strong community with high trusting relationships. It takes no time for someone to solve the mystery that unfolds, the minute they set foot inside of the school, they instantly fall in love with the school and its surroundings. Everyone who has been part of Noah's Ark; parents, children, and staff will vouch for the "gift of time" they have had at this place. With them, everyone takes a bunch of loving memories and a piece of Noah's Ark forever!

We continue to build upon the past journey of the school and look forward to all that lies ahead.

Noah's news - A Closer Look by Sue Enes - Executive Director

"Several weeks ago, the thought came to me, I wonder how many Saint Timothy families and individuals know the history of our parish preschool...what was the vision that inspired its creation, how did it come to be a reality and what role does it play in our parish and the community today.

In 1994 our former rector, The Rev. Stephen Strane had a vision of an early childhood setting on parish grounds. It was to be a faith based, welcoming, and safe environment that would nurture our youngest learners...a gift to our parish children and the broader geographical areas of Alamo, Danville, and San Ramon. During the licensing application and approval period guidance and assistance was given by The Rev. Mark Spalding, associate priest, and the preschool committee. Many members of the Parish volunteered to rejuvenate and prepare the Education Building and a most wonderful transformation took place. Our mantra during the summer months was "build it and they will come" from the movie Field of Dreams...this parish did build it and the children did come! The school opened in the fall of 1996 just slightly under the full enrollment, directed by Susan MacHugh, a parishioner. The next year we had moms or dads spending the night in the breeze way, the night before community registration, to enroll their children for the coming fall classes.

Noah's Ark had always been blessed with full enrollment, 99+ children until the 2008 economic concerns and the 2011-2012 impact of the state mandated Transitional Kindergarten program. Both of these factors decreased enrollment in traditional preschools, such as ours and across the valley... no school escaped. As a Director Mentor for the state and facilitator for the Director's Network at DVC I have seen personally how these two developments affected and continued to affect enrollments.

Our staff has met this challenge by readjusting a program to meet the needs of our families. Our Pre-K program, M-Th, is now a morning program and is in session concurrently with the 4 year old program MWF, and our 3 year old program, TTH. All sessions are in the morning from 9-11:30 or 12:00, with Lunch Bunch from 12-1:30. We listened to the families, their desires and needs and are meeting them at this time. We currently have full enrollment in our Pre-K and 4 year old class. Our 3 year old class is 13

and we would prefer 15-17 children. Our teacher-child ratio remains 1-5 in our older classes and 1-3 in our 3 year old class. The state requires 1-12 and we are pleased that we offer a safer and more responsible ratio.

This has truly been a year that has required us to have new eyes for seeing...a vision for the future needs of our families, teachers, and the role that Noah's Ark will continue to play in our community. I invite you to remember the school, it's families, children, teachers and support staff as we strive to give voice to Saint Timothy's commitment and investment in the lives of the children."
