



The shelter families arrived on Monday and with the help of St. Timothy's and Beth Chaim volunteers, the Parish Hall was transformed into a family shelter for the next two weeks.

With the safety of everyone in mind, we are running the shelter with very few on-site volunteers.

We currently have three families with children ranging in age from 2 to 9 yrs. This is a small group compared to prior years. The program is limiting the number of families due to Covid, but there is room for more and shelter staff is currently interviewing families for admission to the program.

The families have settled in. The meal teams are providing tasty dinners and a few intrepid volunteers are making everything run smoothly.




BOOK GROUP – FEBRUARY 2022
